President Dunning called the meeting to order at 7:00PM

The treasurers report was delivered by the club treasurer, Allan Walker:

Finalized finances from 2022. The club lost \$4,496.60. Mainly due to the \$5,000 donation for the trailer for kids fishing program for the Department of Fish and Wildlife. Without that donation, we would have had a profit of about \$505. So far this year, not much has happened. A few club memberships. The club has hats for sale for \$20.


Fishing reports:

It has been reported that the fishing is good at Rufus Woods by the netpens. Starting to catch big fish down by Pasco. It's a tremendous fishery for trophy Walleye. Starting next month, big fish start to stage at the mouth of the Spokane arm. Males start to come in March and large numbers will be present.

Allan gave a report of perch fishing at Curlew Lake. Caught limits over 10 inches.

President Dunning would like to reinstate the big fish patch. Member would receive a patch for fish over 5 pounds that was caught and released.

Special guest speaker was Danny Garrett from the Department of Fish and Wildlife. He provided good information about the Curlew Lake perch fishery. Also, good fishing for Lake Whitefish at Banks Lake. As for Lake Roosevelt, management is focusing Trout and Salmon somewhat to the detriment of warm water species like Walleye. Danny is part of a team that manages warm water biologists for the state.



Mostly focused on Walleye since not many people keep bass. The presentation was very detailed and gave a great overview of the state of Walleye populations and growth in Lake Roosevelt. Mr. Garrett also discussed Northern Pike and Lake Whitefish. Pike have not been found below Grand Coulee Dam which is good news. The Spokane Tribe places nets in the Spokane arm to catch Pike but will also catch Walleye and Bass.

The 50/50 drawing was held with a prize of \$175

President Dunning spoke about the warm water fishery fund and about how it was heavily influenced by the Spokane Walleye club. The club was also involved in a Walleye mortality study back in the 90's. A bunch of Walleye were caught in the winter and put on stringer hooks and sent back down. Later the Walleye's were brought back to the surface just to find out that Burbot had been feeding on half the fish.

Merlin from Marks Marine had a boat show and provided a booth for the Walleye club to try to gain members. Anyone who purchases a new Lund boat from Marks will be given a years membership to the Spokane Walleye Club.

The club would really like to promote the seminars right after the Big Horn Show. This could be a great way to promote the club and gain new membership.

We would like to see a few members to go to Bear Lake in May and help kids that may be struggling to catch their first fish.
