These will help us get to know one another better, help with remembering names, and will come in handy for members working the Big Horn show. They will be available at the sign-in table at each meeting and should be turned in after the meeting rather than taking them home. *Thanks again, Gary!*

Smiley noted that our efforts have been in promoting the club to the outside and that we need to do more on promoting the club *inside*, make the extra effort to welcome guests and new members, and to invite them fishing — and to help them learn Walleye fishing — which is why we, and they, all joined in the first place.

Fish Days

Smiley noted that our fish days have spotty participation, little coordination, and leave a lot to be desired in terms of organization. Members showing up at different times, then scattering, is nothing more than club members all fishing individually on the same day and in the same general area. This does nothing to promote camaraderie, welcome new members and guests, or improve fishing skills.

Larry Quaintance suggested advance sign-up sheets, scheduling a meeting time at the ramp, making sure that new members and guests are welcomed aboard host boats, then returning for lunch. This was done at his suggestion before and it was a big improvement.

John Calkins suggested using radios and cell phones to better communicate and coordinate while on the water.

Tom Fischer suggested specifying a particular spot to concentrate on while fishing rather than scattering. Also, that some members are averse to weekend fish days due to the typical congestion at the boat ramps on those days.

Allan Walker suggested that we need a fish day coordinator.

Chuck Dunning suggested doing sign-ups in advance for seasoned members willing to host a guest on their boat and for the guests and new members. Then, everyone meeting at a specific time and location.

Merlin Thykeson suggested that we should have our club's banner raised at the meeting location to aid guests and new members in getting to the right place. Merlin also suggested that we could do the willing member / interested guests and new member sign-up lists on line.

John Carruth suggested signing-up the members willing to host a guest and the interested guests and new members at the club meeting prior to the planned club fish day

Chuck Dunning also mentioned previous successful experiences he had at Bear Lake for kids Trout fishing wherein advance posts were made announcing that club members would be at a specific location, date and time for instruction. The turnouts were always good, and rewarding.

Proposed Bylaw Change

Mark McFall noted that there are some awkward points and conflicts in our current procedures for selecting annual awards recipients and has proposed the following changes:

Changes would remove the restrictions that 1.) the Special Appreciation award go only to a board member, 2.) the Member of the Year award go to only general members, and 3.) to remove the requirement that the board approve the awards. We have already bent these rules in the past by awarding a Special Appreciation Award to a non-board member.

These changes give us more flexibility and removes the awkward necessity of having the board approve awards for which a board member is a candidate. The Membership / Awards Committee would be given the authority to make these determinations and if a member of that committee is a candidate, then he/she will be recused by the other members of the committee.

Proposed changes are lined through for deletions and shown in *italics* for additions and replacements. Smiley read these aloud (#1 of 2) at tonight's general membership meeting.

Appendix 3 — **Awards** The Membership Committee shall administer all membership awards per criteria as established for such awards, which are:

- Member of the Year (up to two annually)
- Special Appreciation (up to two annually)

The Membership Committee shall make these determinations and have the awards made for presentation at the Annual Awards Banquet in December. submit a list of candidates for each award to the Board of Directors at the November board meeting. The committee shall, upon approval of the Board of Directors, order the plaques for presentation at the Annual Awards Banquet.

If a member of the committee becomes a candidate for an award, he/she will be recused for purposes of these decisions by the other members of the committee and the President will name a temporary replacement.

AWARD REQUIREMENTS

Member of the Year

Any member in good standing who has served the club with distinction except an Executive or Member of the Board of Directors may be eligible for consideration of this award.

The award shall be a plaque inscribed as follows:

The club may approve two awards annually. Members of the Board of Directors, only, are eligible for consideration of this award.
