Spring Campout and Picnic — June 9-13, 2022

Our annual Spring Picnic will be held at the Locust Grove group campground at Kettle Falls. Check-in starts at noon on Thursday and check-out is at noon on Monday. The picnic is on Saturday June 11th; fish and turkey will be provided and members are requested to bring a pot luck dish. There is also a pot luck breakfast on Sunday morning at about 9:00 AM. There is no camping charge as the club pays for the group campground.

The Spring Picnic raffle items have been purchased. Members are encouraged to donate additional items.

There are no boat docks, so this is pull out every day. There is plenty of space to park boats / trailers at the campground.

A member advised that it recently took 3-1/2 weeks for his annual permit to arrive in the snail mail. Temporary permits are also available at the Super 1 store in Colville. Park Service Golden Age pass holders (AKA: senior citizens) receive a 50% discount.
